Fees may apply for appointments cancelled outside of practice policy requirements.

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Client Rights and Responsibilities

As a client of an Oregon licensee, you have the following rights with respect to the care and services you receive:

- a. To expect that the licensee has met the minimal qualifications of training and experience required by state law;
- b. To examine public records maintained by the Board and to have the Board confirm credentials of the licensee;
- c. To obtain a copy of the Board's *Code of Ethics* (Oregon Administrative Rules 833-100);
- d. To report complaints to the Board;
- e. To be informed of the cost of professional services before receiving said services;
- f. To be assured of privacy and confidentiality while receiving services as defined by rules and law, including the following exceptions:
 1. Reporting suspected child abuse;
 2. Reporting imminent danger to client or others;
 3. Reporting information required in court proceedings, or required by client's insurance company, or other relevant agencies;
 4. Providing information concerning licensee case consultation or supervision;
 5. Defending claims brought against licensee by client
- g. To be free from being the object of discrimination on the basis of race, religion, gender, or other unlawful category while receiving services.
